Free Medical Camp, Rukum

Chaurjahari Hospital Rukum (CHR) is located in Rukum in the Mid-west region of Nepal and is one of the least developed places in Nepal. CHR reported patients facing immense trouble reaching the hospital due to blocked roads caused by landslides caused by heavy rainfall in the past months. CHR planned to conduct Medical Camps in communities affected by the natural disaster. With the support of partners, CHR conducted free medical camps in various communities, namely Kholaguan and Khagal. Furthermore, CHR also carried out an Oral Health Camp for one of the most vulnerable and discriminated communities of Rukum.

Over 665 affected people were seen having sudden onset of chills, fever, headache, backache, sneezing, cough, diarrhea, dysentery, sore throat and other illnesses. Some of them faced severe dehydration. Other major illnesses included acute pelvic disease, worms and parasites, malnutrition, eye/ear infection, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease - smoking associated, allergies and a few new born with birth related problems.

Many people were unaware of their illnesses and did not have any medicine for cure. CHR provided free prescribed medicines for the communities and further recommended severe cases to CHR for treatment.

Successful operation of a 91 years old lady: Lamjung District Community Hospital (LDCH) provided free operation and treatment to Mrs. Gaairadevi Poudel aged 91. She was suffering from fracture of the Neck of the femur bone and had no financial support to pay for her operation. LDCH saw the severity of her condition and performed her hip replacement operation immediately. LDCH provided charity service to her. She recovered from the surgery completely and was able to walk on her own.
